"How can I become a Roadhog?"

The following items are required for Arkansas Razorback Roadhogs, Inc. membership:

- 1. Submit a completed membership application
- 2. Contribute to the Razorback Foundation at least the minimum amount established by the Razorback Athletic Department. (2015 requirement is a minimum \$750.00)

 Donation Acknowledgement Documentation from the Razorback Foundation must accompany Membership Renewal form
- 3. Own a self-contained RV and verify ownership. (suggest RV registration)
- 4. A check payable to AR Razorback Roadhogs for the annual membership fee (currently \$30) This will take your membership to June 30 or the current year.

Members are approved by the Board of Directors 3 times each year. (January, April and July) Qualified members are added to the Waiting List for the opportunity to lease available electrical site.



While in the park...

- The speed limit within the park is 10 miles per hour. Please pay close attention to children playing around sites.
- Fresh water tanks may be filled from the park water system. Do not leave hoses hooked up to the supply faucets.
- Trash should be kept in trash bags. The garbage dumpster is located at the edge of the lower lot by the practice field. Do not leave trash by the storage building near dump stations.
- Pets shall be kept on a leash when the pet is outside the RV. Pet owners shall clean up after their pet(s).
- Quiet period in the park is 11 PM for day games and midnight for night games.
- Members and Visitors shall use generator stacks when running generator in Roadhog Park and, if RV is equipped with either Hydro-Hot or Aqua-Hot systems, a Gen-Turi or similar stack shall be used on the exhaust of these units.
- Parking on the grass is discouraged.

- No parking on baseball field unless so directed by Roadhog personnel. You are welcome to walk your dogs on the baseball field, but please clean up after them.
 Children are welcome to play on the baseball field. Fire lanes must remain clear at all times. Any vehicles left unattended that would interfere with emergency vehicles are subject to being towed at the owners expense.
- Non self-contained generators (trailers and fifth wheels) must be placed where it does not create offensive noise levels for other campers. It is preferable that it be carried down the hill behind the row of campers using an extension cord. All RV's with non self-contained generators will be parked along the south edge of the lot.
- Due to limited space, it is suggested that each RV not have more than two additional automobiles.
- A nondenominational worship service is held at 8:00 am on Sunday morning at the Pavilion on the upper lot. Members and Visitors are welcome.

Roadhog Park staff and volunteers are here to help. If you have questions or need assistance please feel free to flag down one of the golf carts or check with the front gate volunteers.

<u>Visitors</u> and <u>Waiting List</u> members may check into the lower gravel lot for parking from 8:00 a.m. until 10:00 p.m. Members who have designated electrical sites may continue to park at any time.

Did you know....

- Senior Walk starts on Old Main's front step with the year 1876. The names of the more than 125,000 graduates have been chiseled into more than two miles of campus walkways.
- Former President William Jefferson Clinton and US Sec of State Hillary Rodham Clinton started their careers as faculty members of the University of Arkansas.
